

REFLECTIONS ON HOLY WEEK & EASTER by Fr. Tom Gehlsen



On the first day of Holy Week, in our Palm Sunday Service (April 14th), we remember how Jesus and his friends enter Jerusalem. Riding abreast the humble donkey Jesus enters this holiest of cities in defiant criticism of the power that oppresses it and he confirms his role as the one who is destined to suffer at the hands of this same imperial power. While Jesus does promise kingship, he promises a different kind of kingship. One which willing and non-violently accepts the judgement and violence of those who demand to be served for their own purposes. As we gather at the door of St. George's on Palm Sunday and as we process in, we align ourselves with this Jesus, and with this kind of kingship. We bear public witness to God's rule, with its non-violent, creative movement of peace, justice and love.

During our service on Maundy Thursday (Thursday April 18th at 7 pm) we remember afresh what God has done for us in instituting the Eucharist and what we are called to do for each other, symbolised so poignantly in the Washing of Feet.

During our Good Friday Liturgy at 3 pm on Friday April 19th, we proclaim the power of Jesus to save: the power to save every single one of us, irrespective of the number and seriousness of our sins and irrespective of how late we leave our true moment of repentance. On the cross Jesus demonstrates the cornerstone of his royal power, which is the power and authority to forgive sin.

On Easter Morning (April 21st) we will celebrate the awesome reality of the resurrection, by which God invites us all to let Him live in our hearts and minds through the power and presence of the Holy Spirit. At Easter we are invited to open ourselves afresh to the risen Jesus. To welcome Him as a friend, with trust, and to see that only He is life.

Their architect will first check with the City of St. Louis Park for any restrictions they need to be aware of, and will then draw up plans for St. George's to use when hiring a contractor.
