

Q. How do we recognize the presence of the Holy Spirit in our lives?

A. We recognize the presence of the Holy Spirit when we confess Jesus Christ as Lord and are brought into love and harmony with God, with ourselves, with our neighbors, and with all creation.

- An Outline of the Faith, commonly called the Catechism

In my last blog I shared where I experience the presence of the Holy Spirit. As we now move to living fully into the season of Pentecost I am pondering, how am I opening myself to the working of the Spirit through me? For me, this is at the core of God's invitation to join in God's mission for us to become the Beloved Community by following Jesus in living the Way of Love.

Concretely, one of the lenses I find most helpful is in Paul's letter to the Galatians: "The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control . . . If we live by the Spirit, let us also keep in step with the Spirit." (Galatians 5:22-23, 25) As I enter every encounter, every experience, especially those that are particularly challenging, the fundamental question for me is how am I manifesting the fruit of the Spirit?

Am I acting out of a place of fear or love?

Am I embodying a space of negativity or joy?

Am I fueled by anger or am I seeking peace?

Am I filled with anxiety or patience?

Am I approaching others with rudeness or with kindness?

Am I seeking to bring harm or goodness?

Am I living life apathetically or with faithfulness?

Am I experienced by others as hyper-critical or gentle?

Am I expressing myself as reactive or self-controlled?

In this green, growing season of Pentecost may we all strive for ways for the fruit of the Spirit to be manifest through us!

### MEET OUR NEW MUSIC DIRECTOR, JOHN HOFFACKER, D.M.A.

I am really delighted to be joining Father Tom, the choir, and all the wonderful people at St. George's as your music director. For forty years I've been conducting choirs and orchestras in churches, schools, and universities, most recently at Church of the Epiphany in Plymouth. I came



here because of your great tradition of sacred music, community involvement, and warm hospitality.

Claudia and I have two great kids (twins) — Sam, a percussion major at Oberlin, and Kate, majoring in nursing at Illinois Wesleyan University. Claudia works for the League of Minnesota Cities, overseeing their publications and web content. We moved here in 2004 from Massachusetts.

I grew up in western Pennsylvania, went to the University of Virginia, served in the Peace Corps for a couple years in Africa, then went to grad school in Oregon and at Eastman in Rochester NY. Here in Minnesota I've founded a couple choral groups — Chorus Polaris, a chamber choir, and the Minnesota Minnesänger, a German-language chorus based in St. Paul. In addition, I've conducted the symphony orchestras of Golden Valley, Bloomington, and Minnetonka.

Three years ago I started playing the organ for worship at Epiphany, so I don't have the repertoire of other experienced organ players, but I'll try to play so we can all sing with feeling. It will take me a while to learn the instrument, and I'm looking forward to working with everyone to make this a church that sings!



### BUILDINGS & GROUNDS COMMITTEE WHAT HAVE WE BEEN UP TO?

St. George's Buildings & Grounds Committee has been working through a list of "to-dos" this summer. The following is an update on what we have done so far. Thanks to the following committee members for their volunteer work:

Tom Zaun installed a metal strip on the edge of the exterior doorway going into the hallway by the Parish Hall. The wood edge was all chewed up from items being hauled in or out.

Bill Stromberg painted the brown heat vents at the base of the inside windows in the Narthex. He also replaced some lights in the Nursery.

Cyprian Troyer installed metal flashing around the bottom of the posts that hold up the Montessori Little Flowers sign on the corner of Salem Ave. and Minnetonka Blvd. The weekly weed whipping by our lawn mower person has been chewing away at the wood.

Jane Sandsmark painted the wood above the metal flashing that Cyprian installed, making the sign look much fresher. She also prepped and painted the white brick areas outside of the north- and south-facing doors to the Narthex. Jane also took it upon herself to clean (and keep clean) the kitchenette by the Library Lounge.

Kris Kelley and Carole Leonard sanded and primed with oil-base primer 9 of the 20 mental posts that hold up the roof over the garden walkway. They will follow up with a top coat of paint. The other 11 posts are still on the to-do list.

David Sell made the suggestion of replacing the worn-out mats on the floor of the Narthex with outdoor rugs. Carole Leonard purchased and replaced the mats with the rugs.

Geri Alberg and Carole Leonard trimmed the bushes in front of the church on Minnetonka Boulevard. They also maintain the flower gardens each Thursday morning, weather permitting.

Future plans:

- Scrape, prime and paint the west side of the Quonset building.
- Power wash the mildew off the Education Building, and along the garden walk.
- Clean out and organize the garden shed.
- Trim the dead wood out of the crab apple tree in the garden court, and the crab apple tree on the east side of the Education Building.
- Patch the broken cement in some areas, especially on the north side of the Education Building.
- Purchase additional wood chips for the playground. These have been ordered and are scheduled to be delivered the week of June 23.
- Paint a fresh coat of yellow on the "caution" cement areas around the church.
- Repair the top row of the brick wall along the front of the church on Minnetonka Blvd. We are looking into acquiring three quotes for this project.
