

ALREADY, NO KIDDING, LENT ?!!?




Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday (MARCH 6TH) this year and ends on Holy Saturday. The English word "Lent" comes from the Anglo-Saxon word lencten, which means "lengthen" and refers to the lengthening days of "Spring." In many other languages, the word used for this season refers to the 40 - day length of the season or to the fasting that characterizes it. The season is a preparation for celebrating Easter.

Historically, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by converts and then became a time for penance by all Christians. The First Sunday describes Jesus' temptation by Satan, and the Sixth Sunday (Passion/Palm Sunday), Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem and his subsequent passion and death. You can note that the readings during Lent, until Palm Sunday, focus primarily on the meaning of baptism and discipleship, in continuity with the season's original purpose. Because Sundays are always little Easters, the penitential spirit of Lent should be tempered with joyful expectation of the Resurrection.

Holy Week is the final week of Lent, beginning with Palm Sunday and concluding with Holy Saturday. It is during these days that the readings focus primarily on the last days and suffering and death of Jesus.

The Great Three Days – sometimes called the Triduum or Pasch – from sunset Mandy Thursday through sunset Easter Day are the climax of Lent (and of the whole Christian year) and a bridge into the Easter Season. These days proclaim the paschal mystery of Jesus Christ's passion, death, and resurrection. During these days, the community journeys with Jesus from the upper room, to the cross, to the tomb, and to the garden. They should be seen as a great unified service beginning with a service of Holy Eucharist on Maundy Thursday and concluding with the services of Easter Day. These services may be connected with a prayer vigil lasting from Maundy Thursday evening (or Good Friday) until the first service of Easter and may be accompanied by fasting.

#### **ANNUAL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS**

The Annual Meeting of St. George's Episcopal Church was held on Sunday, February 17, 2019. Laura Harmon was appointed Clerk of the Annual Meeting by Father Tom Gehlsen.

The following candidates were elected to the vestry for a three-year term: Lindsay Benjamin, Jane Sandsmark, Sarah Schulte, and Cyprian Troyer. Vestry members who will continue to serve in 2019 are Cathy Asgian, Katheen Boe, Marilyn Clark, Lou Michelich and Jessica Olson. Mike Oiler and Cyprian Troyer were elected as Convention Delegates. Continuing to serve as a Convention Delegate is Harry Kelley.

We extend our deepest sympathy to Jane and Gregg Jacobson and their family on the death of Jane's mother, Glennis Williams. Glennis served for many years as the chairperson of the Altar Guild ans was a long-time and well-loved member of St. George's church.

It is with saddened hearts that we announce Rosalie Michelich has passed away. She was a beloved member of St. George's and we will miss her deeply. She brought joy to those with her praise music and warm smile. The memorial service is at St. George's on March 8. The visitation is at 9am with the service following at 10am. The reception is to follow the service.



The Treasurer's Report for 2018 was presented by Treasurer Connie Kotula. She reported on highlights for 2018: The Endowment Fund balance in December was \$387,400. The Renew the Dragon Capital Campaign currently has available funds of \$53,185. 82% of the total amount pledged has been received. Income highlights: YTD gross income was (\$3,167), pledges YTD deficit was (\$10,342). Expense highlights: YTD Expenses were over budget by \$8,415, and Utilities were over budget by \$8,436.

Rector's Warden Kathleen Boe reported on the process of how the 2019 budget was arrived at. The proposed budget for 2019 had included funds to make the rector position a full-time position and to fund the music program at current levels. However, the pledge drive did not raise the amount hoped for. The Vestry decided that it was important for St. George's to have a full-time rector. It was also important to hire another music director and invest at the same level to our music program in 2019. In order to achieve all three items, the vestry made the decision to move funds from the Endowment Fund.

Connie Kotula gave an overview of the 2019 budget. We were short in total pledges for 2019. \$160,000 was needed, \$146,426 was pledged. The budget includes moving \$25,000 from the Endowment Fund. Little Flowers Montessori agreed to a 2% rent increase and Street Vision Foods agreed to a 2.5% increase. St. George's salaried employees will receive a 3% increase.

Proposed bylaws: St. George's current bylaws had not been revised in many years and were very outdated. A new set of bylaws were presented and proposed by Tom Boe, and were approved.

Capital Campaign: Bill Stromberg reported on completed projects to date which include replacement of the Parish Hall carpet, a new roof on the Education Building, replacement of several windows in the Education Building, brick exterior tuck pointing and the asphalt repaving of the alley parking area. One project remains: the addition of a handicap restroom. The funds available for the project total approximately \$90,000 if all pledges come in as planned (\$53,185 has been collected to-date.)

Parishioners who passed away in the past year were recognized: Steven Bauer, Betsy Furber, Jane Gratton, Karen Hurlbert, Maraline Keeling, Bill Seely, Pat Sturcken, Marion Taylor, Edith Ward and Bob Wheelock.

Rector's Comments: Fr. Tom reported that Dr. Dean Billmeyer, Professor of Music at the University of Minnesota, will be leading the choir for four Sundays in March and on Ash Wednesday. Carole Leonard will be taking on the role as the Overseer of the Church Property working on prioritizing the needs of the parish. The Search Committee for a new music director will be led by Mike Sandsmark and includes Heather Whitesell, Roxy Zuan, Camille Schroeder, Jan Tysk, Father Tom and a consultant. Fr. Tom reported that the Diocese of Minnesota has started the search for a new bishop, and the National Church is in the process of developing a new Book of Common Prayer. Fr. Tom thanked Carole Leonard for her service as Parish Warden for the past four years and Al Kotula for leading the Stewardship Campaign.

The meeting adjourned at 12:05 p.m.
