In Honor of the 2022 Annual Meeting: The Amazing Annual Meeting Overnight Egg Bake!

This Overnight Egg Bake takes just minutes to assemble and can be refrigerated and then baked in the morning.

Ingredients:

- 10 sausage links
- 7 eggs whisked
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 2 slices white bread cubed
- 3 tablespoons milk
- 2 cups shredded hash brown potatoes
- Salt and pepper to taste

Instructions:

- (When you are ready to bake) Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
- Grease an 8x8 pan.
- Cook 10 sausage links in the microwave according to package directions.
- When cooked, chop up sausage into bite sized pieces.
- In a large bowl, whisk eggs then add cheese, cooked sausage links, cubed white bread, and milk and set aside.
- Spread 2 cups of shredded hash brown potatoes onto the bottom of the greased pan.
- Pour egg mixture over top. Add salt and pepper.

Bake at 350 degrees for 40 minutes, or cover and refrigerate overnight, bake in the morning and enjoy. See you on Zoom!


Also I have felt a lot of love with all my numerous surgeries I have gone through. Again prayers and cards and phone calls meant so much to me!!



In the future, STEP will revive the clothes closet where any St. Louis Park resident can "shop" for clothes they might need. This has been closed during the pandemic.


