SAFE CHURCH

As we return to gathering together as a parish, it is imperative that we make certain that St. George's is a safe place for all. ECMN's website states, "In our Baptismal Covenant, we promise to respect the dignity of every human being. One way that we live out that value in ECMN is through the implementation of our Safe Church Policies." Safe Church policies make clear the standards of behavior expected in order to make our faith communities safe places for all of God's people. They include specific guidelines to protect children, youth, and vulnerable adults. At St. George's, we are shoring up our Safe Church commitments and want to let you know who needs to be trained – it could be YOU!

St. George's will be offering presentations of Safe Church Tier 1 during adult education or coffee hour time this fall.

For Tiers 2 and 3, parishioners will take a three-hour online course through ECMN. You can sign up for the training at https://schoolforformation.org/ workshops/safe-church/

The trainings are offered monthly, and we are aiming to have everyone up to date with training by September 1, 2022.

Who needs the trainings?

(trainings are renewed every 3 years)

Tier 2: Safe Church for God's Children

*Staff

*Clergy

*Vestry members

*Anyone with a key to the building

*All leaders in ministry with children, youth, or vulnerable adults

Tier 3: Safe Church for God's People

*Staff *Clergy *Lay Eucharistic Ministers (chalice bearers & lectors) *Vestry members

If you are unsure as to which training you need, please reach out to Marion Hunner in the church office.

In the interest of safety, we will be rekeying the outside doors to the building soon. If you currently have a key, please watch for announcements to pick up a new one.
