

#### I AM GRATEFUL FOR.....!

The following reflection guides us to making gratitude an active part of our lives:

On the way to Jerusalem Jesus was going through the region between Samaria and Galilee. As he entered a village, ten lepers approached him. Keeping their distance, they called out, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us." When he saw them, he said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were made clean. Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice. He prostrated himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him. And he was a Samaritan. Then Jesus asked, "Were not ten made clean? But the other nine, where are they? Was none of them found to return and give praise to God except this for this foreigner?" Then he said to him, "Get up and go your way; your faith has made you well." --- Luke 17:11-19

Examine your heart. Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal to you any attitudes taking God's benefits for granted: for example, discontentment, holding on to your own agenda, complacency. These things blind you to

God's blessings and block you from experiencing and expressing gratitude. What could you do to overcome such hindrances and change your outlook? How can you make giving thanks to God a more conscious and active part of your life?


