Designing a New Year

The New Year can stir up feelings of hope, wonder, and pride, but also guilt, regret, and disappointment. This cocktail of emotions is normal. How do you learn from those feelings so you can prepare for a new and improved New Year? To set yourself up for the best possible year to come, your goal, like most of us, is probably to create more feelings of excitement and joy, and fewer feelings of sadness and regret. To create that for yourself, you must hone in on the highs and lows so you can direct your year, rather than letting it direct you.

All this means it is a wonderful time of year to reflect and contemplate what we have begun in our discernment process.

SO, WHAT'S NEXT?

As the community of St. George's, we have spent the four weeks of Advent embarking on a discernment process that enables us to approach the new year as a journey we need to walk as a community – where do we go from here, are we on the right path?

Discernment, as we have discussed, takes time, contemplation, discussion, prayer, and an ability to recognize that a new opportunity is at hand. What might that be? Right now, we don't know. We have begun

praying, discussing, and opening our hearts to listening to the Spirit for guidance.

These conversations have been deep in prayer and scripture. Many ideas have emerged about the future. Discernment now calls us to take time to pray, reflect, and consult scripture as individuals. So, for January, we are asking that everyone do some soul searching for the direction we need to go. January will be the month of silent, individual discernment regarding our community.

Our annual meeting and the Season of Lent will again allow our community to come together and take further steps, sharing what we have been hearing the Spirit say to us.

On Saturday, January 28th, the Vestry will meet with Kelsey Schuster, Chief of Staff for ECMN, to discuss the discernment process from a Diocesan perspective.

Let each of us, as we enter a new year, continue to pray, contemplate, seek scripture, and offer our thoughts in the vitally important process.







Blessing of the Home on Epiphany

The feast of Epiphany is traditionally celebrated the 12th day of Christmas, January 6. A fun family activity is to bless your home with chalk.

Read the following prayer:

Bless, O Lord God Almighty, this home, that in it there may be health, purity, the strength of humility, goodness and mercy, the fulfillment of Thy law, the thanksgiving to God the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. And may this blessing re-



main upon this home and upon all who dwell herein. Through Christ our Lord.

After the prayer, the initials of the Three Kings (C,M,B - also interpreted as the Latin phrase for Christ Bless the House) are written upon the doors with chalk, sandwiched inside the numbers of the year.

Example: 20+C+M+B+22

What Do the Numbers and Letters Mean?

The first and last numbers simply refer to the current year. The letters C M B come from the traditional names for the three kings: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. Some also suggest "Christus Mansionem Benedicat" which means, "May Christ bless this dwelling!"

Welcoming our new neighbors

St. George's is currently partnering with St. Christopher's in Roseville to assist with driving a family of new Afghan neighbors to and from their ESL classes. The family arrived in September of this year and is a lovely group of women: Zainab (60), Aziza (28), Razia (28). Farzana (20), Roqia (19), and Zakira (17).

St. Christopher's is one of the churches in the diocese that has chosen to sponsor an Afghan family, but the family has an apartment in St. Louis Park, which is a significant drive from Roseville. We are thrilled that Marion Hunner thought to connect us with her home church so that we can assist with driving three days a week. We have a group of seven volunteer drivers who take turns either picking up the women from their home and transporting them to class or driving them from class back home. Even in that short time that we're with the family, we have felt their warmth and graciousness. Some of us have been taught a few words in Persian or have had the chance to listen to Afghan music while in the car. They have invited us into their home for tea and for lunch. It has been a beautiful experience to help in welcoming some of our newest neighbors to St. Louis Park. We look forward to hosting the drivers from St. Christopher's as well as our new Afghan friends at coffee hour on February 12.
